As we close down our Rider Points season, it is very important to get the sign-up sheets to me. We need an accurate tally by early October for our Awards Banquet. Wow! Did I just say October? Awards Banquet? With so many great rides still to be ridden?

Although it's August (already!) and summer is slowly winding down, the biking season is far from over. Remember, we have rides every Saturday and Sunday through the end of October (October 28). And August, September, and October have some of the best biking weather of the year.

Several upcoming fundraising rides deserve mention.

- **Sunday, August 26 is the Cream City Cycle Club Century.** This ride (35, 62, or 100 mile routes) thru the scenic Southern Kettle Moraine starts in Waterford, WI. Registration is required and includes rest stops, spaghetti dinner, and showers. Please support this local club ride! More information at (414) 299-9398 and www.creamcitycycleclub.com.
- **Sunday, September 9 is the Door County Century.** Routes are 30, 65, 75, and 100 miles. Registrations must be postmarked by September 3. Fee includes rest stops, spaghetti dinner, showers, and DCC pin. The ride starts at Sevastopol School in Institute, WI (6 miles north of Sturgeon Bay, WI). Note: The DCC is a popular ride for BVBC members. If you're planning to be in Door County the weekend of September 8, 9, 10, 11 and want to socialize (group ride, supper, etc.) on Saturday and ride together on Sunday, please email clarebeach@yahoo.com.
- **Sunday, September 16 is Pedal the Kettle.** Explore the backroads of scenic Waukesha County on 30, 60 or 100 mile routes. Registration includes rest stops, a meal, and showers. Road Rules – “45 Second Rule”

Wisconsin State Statutes [346.37(1) 4]

A recently enacted Wisconsin law, nicknamed the “45 Second Rule,” applies to bicycles and motorized vehicles that are not heavy enough to trip traffic signal sensors embedded in the road. That law, summarized below, allows a biker to proceed thru a red light in certain situations.

The operator of a bicycle, motor bicycle, motorcycle, or moped who is facing a red signal at an intersection may, after stopping for not less than 45 seconds, proceed cautiously through the intersection before the signal turns green if:

- No other vehicles are present at the intersection to actuate the signal and
- The operator of the bicycle, motor bicycle, motorcycle, or moped reasonably believes the signal is vehicle-actuated

The operator of a bicycle, motor bicycle, motorcycle, or moped proceeding through a red signal in this situation must yield the right-of-way to any vehicular traffic, pedestrian, bicyclist, or rider of an electric personal assistive mobility device that is proceeding through a green signal at the intersection, lawfully within a crosswalk, or using the intersection.

(Arrive early so you're ready at the start time)

Saturday, August 18, 2007

Menomonee Falls/Neosho. Ride west from Menomonee Falls to Neosho and back. Scenic and very challenging in spots. Ride Distance 29, 49 or 59 miles. Starts at Village Park in Menomonee Falls. Take I-94 west to US 45. North on 45 to Appleton Ave. Northwest on Appleton Ave to Garfield Dr. (across from bank in downtown). Left on Garfield Dr. to Village Park on left. Approximate drive time: 20 minutes from Zoo.

Sunday, August 19, 2007

Parkside. Easy ride through Kenosha County. Ride Distance 29 or 50 miles. Starts near Petrified Springs Park in Kenosha. Take I-94 south, exit at County E (Kenosha), east on County E approximately 5 miles to Hwy 31, left on Hwy 31 for 0.3 miles, right on JR for 0.6 miles to parking lot on the left, just outside of Petrified Springs Park.

Sunday, August 19, 2007

Tour de Fort. Annual fund raiser for the MACC fund (registration required). Organized ride in Fort Atkinson. Hosted by Tour de Fort Bicycle Club. Ride Distance 19, 35 or 63 miles. Starts in Fort Atkinson, WI. Directions on brochure are confusing, use Business 26. On Line registration @ www.jcbc.info

Saturday, August 25, 2007

Brown Deer to Cedarburg. Fairly easy ride, mostly rural areas through River Hill, Mequon and Cedarburg. Ride Distance 26 or 34 miles. Starts at Brown Deer Park. Take I-43 north to Good Hope Rd., west to Teutonia Ave., right on Teutonia (approximately 1/2 mile), right on Calumet. Cross RR tracks, turn left at stop sign.

Sunday, August 26, 2007

Cream City Century. Annual Cream City Cycle Club ride (registration fee required). Ride Distance 35, 62 or 100 miles. Starts at Waterford Union High School. Take Hwy 36 SW to Hwy 20, then west on Hwy 20/83 into Waterford. Turn left on S. Center St., follow signs for parking lots south and west of the high school.

Saturday, September 01, 2007

LaGrange Southern Kettle Moraine. Scenic ride through Southern Kettle Moraine. Ride Distance 23 or 49 miles. Starts from LaGrange General store. Take I-43 southwest to East Troy. West on WI 20 to US 12. West on US 12 to LaGrange. Park in the lot at the intersection of US 12 and Cty. H. Approximate drive time: 50 minutes

Sunday, September 02, 2007

Harrington Beach. A Get In Gear ride (24 miles)! Ride along Lake Michigan north to Harrington Beach and back. Ride Distance 24, 54 or 64 miles. Longer routes start at Virmond Park in Mequon. Take I-43 to Mequon Rd. East on Mequon Rd. to Lakeshore Dr. South approximately 3/4 mile to Virmond Park (on left). Short route starts ONE HOUR after long route from the Marina in Port Washington. Take I-43 north to WI 32, 32 northeast into Port Washington, right on Washington St to marina. Approximate drive time: 40 minutes from Zoo.

Monday, September 03, 2007

Cool Doctor. Ride west on the New Berlin Recreational Trail, through Waukesha to the Glacial Drumlin Trail, and on to Dousman. Return same route. Turn around in Waukesha or Wales, or Dousman. Ride Distance 20, 33 or 44 miles. Starts at Greenfield Park. Take I-894, exit at Greenfield Ave. Go west to 124th St. Turn Left on 124th and left into park at the Cool Waters Sign. Park in the north lot across from the water park.

Saturday, September 08, 2007

Beaver Lake. Old TREK 100 routes that go around Pewaukee, Beaver, Pine and Nagawicka Lakes. Challenging. Ride Distance 30 or 62 miles. Starts at WCTC in Pewaukee. Take I-94 west, right on WI 16. Exit at WCTC/Main St. Turn left across bridge, go straight in to WCTC parking lot. Approximate drive time: 15 minutes from Zoo.

Sunday, September 09, 2007

Door County Century. Annual fund raiser in Door County (preregistration by Sept 3 required). Ride Distance 30, 65, 75, or 100 miles. See Ride Chair, Ride column for Club-related info. For information: www.DoorCountyCentury.com (715) 276-2320.

Sunday, September 09, 2007

Whitnall South. Easy ride into Racine county and back Ride Distance 22, 37 or 58 miles. Starts at Whitnall Park Golf Course on 92nd Street just north of Rawson Ave.

Saturday, September 15, 2007

Pewaukee Lake Ride. This ride goes around Pewaukee Lake with some hilly sections. Ride Distance 18 or 35 miles. Starts at Mitchell Park in Brookfield. Take I-94 west to Barker Rd exit. North on Barker Rd to River Rd (just north of RR tracks). East (RIGHT) on River Rd .3 mile to park. Park in lot south of red shed.

Saturday, September 15, 2007

Maywood Earth Ride. Fund raiser ride with five scenic routes through Sheboygan County to benefit the Ellwood May Environmental Park Ride Distance 25, 50 or 64 miles. Take I-43, exit #128 go southeast 1.1 mile on Hwy 42. Turn right on Mueller Road; park entrance is 0.2 mile on left. For more details check out the website.

Sunday, September 16, 2007

Pedal the Kettle. Annual Spring City Spinners Club ride (registration fee required). Ride Distance 30, 60 or 100 miles. Starts at Waukesha North High School, 2222 Michigan Ave, Waukesha. Take I-94 west to Hwy T (Grandview Blvd), south to Michigan Ave, right turn at school. Information at www.springcityspinners.org and (414) 279-9135.

Sunday, September 16, 2007

Zoo Ride. Ride on the Wild Side. Serve as route marshals

Bike Federation Ride. Registration required. 11, 16, 30, 62 miles, www.bfw.org.

Saturday, September 22, 2007

Hunters Lake Picnic Ride. Kelly Kuhs picnic ride in the Dousman-Ottawa Lake area. Members only. Bring a dish to pass. RSVP to Kelly by Thursday, Sept 20 at 262-522-7316 or kkuhs@morriscranes.com. Ride Distance 35 miles. Take I-94 west to Hwy 67 and go south to Road 10 (two miles south of Hwy 18). Go left (east) on Road 10 to second last house on road.

Delafield Lake Country. Scenic ride through lake country around Delafield, long route passes near Holy Hill, Pike Lake and Hartford. Ride Distance 20, 29 or 57 miles. Starts at Cushing Park. I-94 west to County C (Delafield), left (north) on C 0.4 miles to Main St. Left (west) on Main St. 1/2 mile to Cushing Park Rd. (by Kurts Steak House), right on Cushing Park Rd. 1/5 mile to parking lot just across bridge. Approximate drive time: 25 minutes from Zoo.

Saturday, September 29, 2007

Burlington Roll. Easy ride between Wind Lake and Burlington. Ride Distance 23 or 33 miles. Starts at Heg Park. Take WI 36 (Loomis Rd) south towards Wind Lake. Heg Park is approximately 1 mile past Wind Lake, watch for signs on the right.

Sunday, September 30, 2007

LaGrange - Whitewater. Scenic ride through Southern Kettle Moraine between LaGrange and Whitewater. Ride Distance 30 or 56 miles. Starts from LaGrange General store. Take I-43 southwest to East Troy. West on WI 20 to US 12. West on US 12 to LaGrange. Park in the lot at the intersection of US 12 and Cty. H. Approximate drive time: 50 minutes from Zoo.
