You simply follow the link and build your profile.

### On The Road

I'll admit that I was hesitant to accept the position, given that for the past three years, all I've heard is Joe whining about what a time consuming and thankless job it is.

It turns out that Joe's grumbling was a tad overblown. Thanks to the awesome Ride Chair app that Kent wrote a few years ago, one simple click generates the ride schedule for the entire season. ## **Climbing the Social Ladder**

We then biked back to Marathon and Key Largo. Each day brought us 22 mph headwinds, so the ride back was challenging physically and mentally. All in all, we had a great trip! (Even Mike Smiley said he had fun even though there weren't any hills for him!)



## 105-Year-Old Cyclist Rides 14 Miles In An Hour En Route To A World Record

Frenchman Robert Marchand set a new world record Wednesday when he cycled 22.547 kilometers (about 14 miles) in an hour — at the age of 105.

Wearing a purple and yellow cycling suit, pink helmet and yellow glasses, Marchand completed 92 laps at the Velodrome National, an indoor track near Paris that's used for elite cycling events. According to The Associated Press, he set a new record for the 105-plus age group and received a standing ovation from people in the crowd, who chanted "Robert, Robert" as he rolled to a stop. Still, he said he could have done better.

"I did not see the sign warning me I had 10 minutes left," Marchand said, according to the AP.
"Otherwise I would have gone faster, I would have posted a better time. I'm now waiting for a rival."

For comparison, the U.K.'s Bradley Wiggins rode 54.526 kilometers (about 34 miles) in 2015 and holds the record for the men's hour, the BBC reported.

"I am not here to be champion. I am here to prove that at 105 years old you can still ride a bike," Marchand said, per Eurosport.

His record-breaking ride Wednesday was incredible, but Marchand's entire life has been a series of singular events. The AP has this on his background:

"Marchand, a former firefighter who was born in 1911 in the northern town of Amiens, has lived through two world wars. He led an eventful life that took him to Venezuela, where he worked as a truck driver near the end of the 1940s. He then moved to Canada and became a lumberjack for a while.

"Back in France in the 1960s, Marchand made a living through various jobs that left him with no time to practice sports.

"He finally took up his bike again when he was 68 years old and began a series of cycling feats."

"The diminutive Marchand — he is 1.52 meters (5-foot) tall and weighs 52 kilograms (115 pounds) — rode from Bordeaux to Paris, and Paris to Roubaix several times. He also cycled to Moscow from Paris in 1992.

"Ten years later, he set the record for someone over the age of 100 riding 100 kilometers (62 miles)." So what's his secret? Marchand's coach and friend Gerard Mistler told the AP it's simple: He eats fruits and vegetables, doesn't smoke, drinks wine only on occasion, goes to bed at 9 p.m. and exercises every day.

Mistler, perhaps cognizant of the cloud of doubt that hovers over impressive cycling performances, told the news service: "If [he] had been doping, he would not be there anymore." And if this story get any better, here's some amazing photos of the feat.

### **Ride Leader Responsibilities**

Being a ride leader is lots of fun and earns you additional rider points. Just remember:

- Be on time, or preferably, a little early.
- Be sure all riders sign the waiver sheet. Have them indicate the number of miles they intend to ride.
- Provide and distribute the ride route map to all riders.
- Pack and carry a First Aid Kit. If you don't have a kit or need additional supplies, please contact
  the Ride Chair. Render assistance as needed and as you are able. In case of an accident
  involving more serious injury or property damage, fill out the enclosed incident report when
  time permits. This will allow a claim to be submitted to our insurer.
- At rest and lunch stops, do a check to make sure all riders are accounted for. At the end of the ride, again double-check on riders to make sure everyone made it back.
- Have fun!
- After the ride, return the waiver sheet (and ride package) to the Ride Chair so that everyone can qualify for rider points and to satisfy our insurance requirements.
- Make notes after the ride (where to eat afterwards, where to park, any problems with the route (places people got lost, incorrect mileage, bad corners, etc.)) for the next ride leader and turn in to the Ride Chair.
