## Message from our Ride Chair By Andy Sikorski

As the calendar turns to April, we anticipate the start of another BVBC season. We had a great turnout at the kickoff party a couple of weeks back, where the season schedule was annou... Wait...what's that you say ...?

I'm sorry, I'm now being told that the current newsletter deadline is for the June issue, not April, when this season preview article was originally scheduled to appear. I'm not sure how I keep missing deadlines - it sure hasn't been because I've been out riding in the beautiful Wisconsin spring weather.

My tardiness means you already know about the two brand new routes for the year - Pike River was ridden on April 26<sup>th</sup> and Calhoun Cruise is our primary Thursday evening route every week through July. We've also already ridden the two routes which had their start location moved to Oakwood Golf: Southern Sodbuster and- Oakwood to Gorney (formerly named Gorney Park).

However, there are a few updates still worth discussing. After releasing an initial schedule with many more than the usual number of 'TBD' dates, a bunch of our favorite routes have been added back. Bugline, Classic Mash Up, Elm Grove Stonecutter, Oconomowoc Eagle, Three Trails West, and Waukesha - Wern Valley were temporarily on hold until we worked with the folks at the Waukesha County

Parks department to ensure we would be permitted to use portions of their county trails.

Another 'new' route is scheduled for June 28<sup>th</sup>. After too much tinkering by me and my predecessor (I'm looking at you, Joe), Gil's Ride TO Rome returns in its original form and with Dousman once again the start location. I'm looking forward to riding it as Gil intended it.

You'll also see a ride entitled Glacial Lake Scuppernong scheduled for July  $12^{th}$ . Many of the roads will be familiar from the former LaGrange - Southern Kettle, but the start location has been moved to Eagle Town Park. The name change is thanks to a suggestion from Helen, who through her exploration of the Ice Age Trail, felt it was fitting to recognize the huge body of water which once covered much of the area through which our Kettle Moraine routes pass.

The thing which many of these changes have in common is that they reduce driving times to the start locations. This has been a recurring theme of feedback received from members over the past few years. Hopefully this has been improved, but without sacrificing our traditional balance between the beautiful suburban and rural areas Southeastern Wisconsin has to offer.

The other change announced at the kickoff party is that this will be my final season as Ride Chair, and that's a topic I'll discuss further in the July edition (I'll set a reminder so I don't miss another deadline).

Stay safe, and I hope to see all of you on an upcoming ride.
